



Our social action projects include funding a ramp in our sanctuary to provide equal access to handicapped worshippers, Tikkun Olam Go Gos, which supports the Steven Lewis Foundation in Africa, collecting and distributing “Bedtime Kits for Kids” which go to local shelters, camperships and help to B’nai Mitzvah students in our congregation who are in need.

The “Soup Shvesters” project recognizes that 16% of the Jewish population in Vancouver lives below the poverty line. 95 seniors have been identified as using the Jewish Food Bank in Vancouver. The Jewish Food Bank is a joint project of Jewish Women International-BC and Jewish Family Services. The soup that we were able to make and package and distribute with the generous advice and help of Soup Sisters, will go to these seniors in distributions several times a month.

For our first soup-making, we used the kitchen of the synagogue, had seven wonderful women chopping and tasting and ladling and were able to make 90 litres of soup. And . . . we had a ball!
